

AS WE GATHER

God's richest blessings on your worship here with us! Today, we join with Habakkuk in the cry of "How Long o Lord?" Habakkuk was living in a time when the kingdom of Judah was living in faithlessness and lawlessness. Habakkuk was asking how long God would put up with such injustice before acting. When God told Habakkuk what he was going to do about the injustice, Habakkuk had a hard time understanding why God would act in that way. So often we are like Habakkuk, asking how long he is going to allow evil to continue, not just in our society but in our own lives as well. However, God reminds Habakkuk that the righteous will live by Faith. So the thought for today's service is, "how do we remain faithful even when we don't understand what God is doing in our lives?"

Lector: The oracle that Habakkuk the prophet saw.

and why do you idly look at wrong? Destruction and violence are before me;

Lector: Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God according to the

promise of the life that is in Christ Jesus,

To Timothy, my beloved child:

Grace, mercy, and peace from God the Father and Christ Jesus our

Lord.

I thank God whom I serve, as did my ancestors, with a clear conscience, as I remember you constantly in my prayers night and day. As I remember your tears, I long to see you, that I may be filled with joy. I am reminded of your sincere faith, a faith that dwelt first in your grandmother Lois and your mother Eunice and now, I am sure, dwells in you as well. For this reason I remind you to fan into flame the gift of God, which is in you through the laying on of my hands, for God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control.

Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began, and which now has been manifested through the appearing of our Savior Christ Jesus, who abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel, for which I was appointed a preacher and apostle and teacher, which is why I suffer as I do. But I am not ashamed, for I know whom I have believed, and I am convinced that he is able to guard until that day what has been entrusted to me. Follow the pattern of the sound words that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus. By the Holy Spirit who dwells within us, guard the good deposit entrusted to you.



LUKE 17:1-10 (ESV)


Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Luke the seventeenth chapter.



And he said to his disciples, "Temptations to sin are sure to come, but woe to the one through whom they come! It would be better for him if a millstone were hung around his neck and he were cast into the sea than that he should cause one of these little ones to sin. Pay attention to yourselves! If your brother sins, rebuke him, and if he repents, forgive him, and if he sins against you seven times in the day, and turns to you seven times, saying, 'I repent,' you must forgive him."

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" And the Lord said, "If you had faith like a grain of mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you.

"Will any one of you who has a servant plowing or keeping sheep say to him when he has come in from the field, 'Come at once and recline at table'? Will he not rather say to him, 'Prepare supper for me, and dress properly, and serve me while I eat and drink, and afterward you will eat and drink'? 



Monday- Psalm 13

What was causing David to say "how long?" What do the final two verses of the Psalm reveal about how to remain faithful while asking this question?

Tuesday- Ruth 1:15-18

At this point Ruth and Naomi had lost nearly everything. Ruth had an opportunity to go and make a life for herself, but said these verses instead. What do you think helped her respond in this way?

Wednesday- Job 38:1-7

The majority of the book of Job is him and his friends questioning and pondering over the justice of God. What is God telling Job by these verses, and how do they help us when we begin to doubt the actions of God?

Thursday- Isaiah 55:8-9

What are some things you know that God has done that astound you because you didn't think they could/would be done? How does this help us in difficult situations?

Friday- Luke 23:39-42

What thing does Jesus do here that is hard to understand? Why did he do it?

Our Belief and Practice

Our congregation believes that Holy Communion is a gift of Christ to His Church. Out of loving concern for the communicants and our understanding of the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions, we request that those who commune here:

- 1. Be Baptized Christians.
- 2. Are mature enough to examine themselves, recognizing their sin and their need for God's grace. (1 Corinthians 11:28)
- 3. Believe that in Holy Communion they receive Christ's body and blood in, with, and under the bread and wine for the gracious remission of their sins. (*Matthew* 26:26-28)
- 3. Do so without giving offense to others. (i.e., Willing to forgive and be reconciled) (*Matthew 18:15-17*)

Guests of the congregation, who are instructed in Luther's Small Catechism, are welcome to receive Holy Communion. All others are asked to speak with the pastor regarding the sacrament. Noncommuning children may join their parents. Communicants may choose from the Common Cup or individual cups.
