#### Le Fin!!

According to family legend, after my mother fell off the porch at our house in Pontiac, she soon became pregnant for me and I was eventually born. I have never explored the "something shook loose" assertion and I can't now even if I wanted to. The year 1957 was the height of the baby boom. The year 2024 will see an estimated 12,000 Americans turn 65 every day. That baby boom that filled Sunday school at Immanuel in 1957 is the same baby boom that will fill its Columbarium (someday). Between now and then is a time of retirement that involves its own contributions to the church for many of you. For me it must involve my leaving.

My Concordia Seminary class now has about 50% of its graduates still active in pastoral ministry. I will stand in the middle of that "bell curve." It is the place I always wanted—in the middle of pastoral ministry. All I ever wanted to do was to baptize, marry and bury as the people of God needed. Although I never minded the idea of being "successful," I was never ambitious for larger churches or ministries. I am proud in the best sense of the word to have been a small church pastor.

American movies have two main forms of nostalgic endings. The first is to tell you where all the young characters end up as they grow old. For example, Bluto of Animal House must, of course, become Senator Blutarsky. As you have heard me say before, I will end up in ashes and dust. If you prefer, think of me sitting on a rock in Wyoming surrounded by mountains.

A second type of ending that explores the conclusion of an era or a life shows flashback images of all the key moments. Given how visual my brain works, I am easily dizzy with the swirl of pictures that fill my memories. I have had the privilege of joining the people of God in the most personal, private, and important moments of their lives. Those memories still overwhelm me emotionally and spiritually. Of course, the best ending for a movie is the French way—the action just cuts to FIN. The future is for the next film.

I am confident in the future of the Church because Christ has promised to take care of it. I believe the denomination, the Lutheran Church Missouri Synod, will continue to argue with itself over what it means to be a European thinking church living in the American experience. It is an unresolvable internal contradiction. The Michigan District remains well served and well run. It understands the state, its churches, and its people. I am confident in Immanuel and its leadership. The challenge in ministry is always to use the past for the purpose of the future—neither refusing to leave the past nor forgetting its lessons. Immanuel has a good past and I expect it to have a good future.

It is your church. You called me to serve your church and promised to help me. I am returning your call with gratitude.

In most contexts, praying for your successor would be seen as a bit of an insult to your employer. In our context, it is the most important and well-meaning task of the moment. Let us all pray for the Pastor that our Lord knows we need and has already prepared for just this time and place. In Christ's love and service,

# Our Mission in JANUARY is...



#### **Grocery Pantry Program**

The Grocery Pantry Program (GPP) is our primary food assistance distribution program. Last year, the GPP served over 100,000 food orders to over 28,000 unduplicated individuals.



#### Mobile Food Initiative

The **Mobile Food Initiative**, one of Kalamazoo Loaves & Fishes' food programs, makes an impact for many in this community.

The goal of this program is to get additional grocery items into the hands of people who need them in Kalamazoo County and surrounding communities. Food is distributed on a first-come-first-served basis. As with most other KLF programs, there are no eligibility requirements or paperwork to fill out. If the distribution site is at a school, you do not need to have a child at the school to attend. *Food is free to local residents.* 

Each MFI distributes various approximately 5-7 perishable and non-perishable food items, including fresh fruits and vegetables, at specific sites throughout the county. Specific food items vary among dates and locations. This program distributes food at over eight sites each month with additional pop-up locations periodically.


